CYCLING AND HOROLOGY

Presented by Lorne Shields

We were very fortunate to have the opportunity to enjoy Lorne Shields present "Cycling and Horology" at our November 25 meeting.

Lorne, is a long-time member of our NAWCC (#20,047) and has collected many aspects of historic cycliana for over 51 years.

Some items from his collection have been on display at the Smithsonian Institution at Washington D.C., the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto, Canada's National Museum of Science & Technology in Ottawa and the Musée de Science et Industrie in St. Etienne France to name a few.

He has given presentations across Canada, the USA, England, France, Portugal, Germany and the Netherlands.

Everything illustrated and discussed related to Horology, with a direct link to Cycling all with original material from within Lorne's collection.







The first set of slides included contemporary 19th century photographs which showed Watch & Clock stores, Watches, Clocks, Fobs and horological objects associated with people or as used on bicycles.

Illustrations of important Patent Books, miscellaneous Ephemera, Catalogues and Trade Cards were included and referred to. Of particular interest to our members were correspondence and financial documents from Pequegnat of

Watchmakers were the primary makers of distance measuring instruments. The machinery needed to produce these was the lifeblood of the watch making industry. Those mileage meters (aka odometers and cyclometers) of the high wheel era (mid-1870s to 1890) are rarely found. Used in the

presentation were 5 of these cyclometers. All of these 5 cyclometers were different and they were shown in matching contemporary photos of them mounted on the front hub of High Wheel or "Ordinary" bicycles. Today we commonly call these bicycles Penny Farthings but that is a misnomer and the name did not come into usage until about five years after their obsolescence.

Examples of mileage meters from the 1890s were on display. They were generally more compact than those of the high wheel era.

These were of particular interest as recognizable brands such as the American Clock Co., Ingersoll, New York Standard Watch Co., Seth Thomas, Trenton Watch Co. & Waltham were on display.



Two important objects worth noting were present. The first was a pocket watch dial ca 1820 with a Hobby-horse (a primitive and early cycle). The second was a pocket watch key ca 1869 with a figural Lady Velocipedist at the top.



Watch Fobs with figural cycling themes were both projected and presented. These ranged from ca 1875 to 1900.



Pocket watches were of interest to our members. The designs, materials, movements and styles varied. Worth noting were a high wheel era watch with enameling, another of niello in gold and silver, a hand engraved sterling silver example of an exceptionally rare Safety bicycle called a Quadrant, large sized examples, a gold Elgin full hunter case designed with a child riding on the front of a bicycle and another watch with an automaton movement having a Penny Farthing cyclist's knee going up and down as if pedaling away. A cyclist's handlebar mount watch holder with a Waltham watch was on display and projected in a contemporary photograph.

Lastly, a selection of eight different 19th century clocks was presented. The earliest was a Clock & Barometer example in the form of a Penny Farthing bicycle ca 1879. Some others had full figural cyclists. The most important was an Automated Bronze and Marble clock of French manufacture produced in 1891. Two full figural bicycle clocks of the 1890s were displayed.





There were many questions and as many answers.

Our members were quite intrigued with the subject and Lorne was very pleased to have been able to share his collection with some of his friends and fellow members.



We want to thank Lorne for sharing his vast knowledge of a subject that is not well appreciated by many clock and watch enthusiasts.

Lorne's exceptional presentation provided wonderful relevance to both horology and Canadian interests. It was a real pleasure for all who attended.
